1 Corinthians 9:²⁶ So I do not run **AIM**lessly; I do not box as one beating the air. ²⁷ But I discipline my body and keep it under control, **lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.**

James 2:¹⁹ You believe that God is one; you do well. Even the demons believe—and shudder!

Acts 6: ⁸And Stephen, full of grace and power, was doing great wonders and signs among the people. ⁹ Then some of those **who belonged to the synagogue** of the Freedmen (as it was called), and of the Cyrenians, and of the Alexandrians, and of those from Cilicia and Asia, rose up **and disputed** with Stephen.

Acts 7:¹ And the high priest said, "Are these things so?" ² And Stephen said: "**Brothers and fathers**, hear me. The God of glory appeared to **our father Abraham** when he was in Mesopotamia, before he lived in Haran, ⁴⁴ "**Our fathers** had the tent of witness in the wilderness, just as he who spoke to Moses directed him to make it, according to the pattern that he had seen. ⁴⁵ **Our fathers** in turn brought it in with Joshua when they dispossessed the nations that God drove out before **our fathers**. ⁵¹ "You stiff-necked people, uncircumcised in heart and ears, you always resist the Holy Spirit. As **your fathers did, so do you.** ⁵² Which of the prophets did **your fathers** not persecute? **And they killed** those who announced beforehand the coming of the Righteous One, whom **YOU have now** betrayed and murdered, ⁵³ **you who received the law** as delivered by angels and did not keep it." ⁵⁴ Now when **they heard these things** they were enraged, and they ground their teeth at him. ⁵⁵ But he, full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. ⁵⁶ And he said, "Behold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God."

Hebrews 9:¹² he **entered once** for all into the holy places, not by means of the blood of goats and calves but by means of his own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption.

²⁷ And just as it is appointed for man to die once, **and after that** comes judgment,

²⁸ **SO** Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, **not to deal with sin BUT** to **save** those who are eagerly waiting for him.

Acts 7: ⁵⁷ But they cried out with a loud voice and stopped their ears and rushed together at him.

⁵⁸Then they cast him out of the city and stoned him. And the witnesses laid down their garments at the feet of a **young man named Saul**. ⁵⁹And as they were stoning Stephen, he called out, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." ⁶⁰And falling to his knees he cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." And when he had said this, he fell asleep.

Acts 8: ¹**And Saul approved** of his execution.

NLT: ¹Saul was one of the witnesses, and **he agreed completely** with the killing of Stephen.

²Devout men buried Stephen and made great lamentation over him. ³**But Saul was ravaging the church**, and entering house after house, he dragged off men and women and committed them to prison.

Acts 9: ¹**But Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord**, went to the high priest ²and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any belonging to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. ³Now as he went on his way, he approached Damascus, and suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. ⁴And falling to the ground **he heard a voice** saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" ⁵And he said, "Who are you, Lord?" And he said, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. ⁶But rise and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do." ⁷The men who were traveling with him stood speechless, hearing the voice but **seeing no one**. ⁸Saul rose from the ground, and although his eyes were opened, **he saw nothing**. So they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. ⁹And for three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank.

Acts 9: ¹⁰Now there was a disciple at Damascus named Ananias. The Lord said to him in a vision, "Ananias." And he said, "Here I am, Lord." ¹¹And the Lord said to him, "Rise and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul, for behold, he is praying, ¹²and he has seen in a vision a man named Ananias come in and lay his hands on him so that he might regain his sight." ¹³But Ananias answered, "Lord, I have heard from many about this man, **how much evil he has done to your saints** at Jerusalem. ¹⁴And here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who call on your name." ¹⁵But the Lord said to him, "Go, **for he is a chosen instrument of mine** to carry my name before the Gentiles **and** kings **and** the children of Israel. ¹⁶For I will show him how much **he must suffer for the sake of my name**." ¹⁷So Ananias departed and entered the house. And laying his hands on him he said, "**Brother Saul**, the Lord Jesus who appeared to you on the road by which you came has sent me so that you may regain your sight and

be filled with the Holy Spirit."

¹⁸And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and he regained his sight. Then he rose and was baptized; ¹⁹and taking food, he was strengthened. For some days he was with the disciples at Damascus. ²⁰And **immediately he proclaimed Jesus in the synagogues**, saying, "He is the Son of God." ²¹And all who heard him were amazed and said, "Is not this the man **who made havoc** in Jerusalem of those who called upon this name? And has he not come here for this purpose, to bring them bound before the chief priests?" ²²But Saul increased all the more in strength, and confounded **the Jews** who lived in Damascus by proving that **Jesus was the Christ**. ²³When many days had passed, the Jews plotted to kill him, ²⁴but their plot became known to Saul. They were watching the gates day and night in order to kill him, ²⁵but his disciples took him by night and let him down through an opening in the wall, lowering him in a basket. ²⁶And when he had come to Jerusalem, **he attempted to join the disciples**. And they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple.

²⁷But Barnabas took him and brought him to the apostles and declared to them how on the road he had **seen** (*eidó* - *be aware, behold, consider, perceive, to see (literally or figuratively); by implication*) the Lord, **who spoke to him**, and how at Damascus he had preached boldly in the name of Jesus. ²⁸So he went in and out among them at Jerusalem, preaching boldly in the name of the Lord. ²⁹And spoke and disputed against the Hellenists. But they were seeking to kill him. ³⁰And when the brothers learned this, they brought him down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus. ³¹So the church throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria **had peace and was being built up**. And **WALKING in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it multiplied**.

1 Corinthians 10:⁵Nevertheless, with most of them **God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness**.

¹²Therefore let anyone **who thinks that he stands** take heed **lest he fall**.

Romans 10: ¹³For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be **saved**."

1 Corinthians 1:¹Paul, called by the will of God to be an apostle of Christ Jesus, and our brother Sosthenes,

²To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints together with all those who in every place **call** (*present-middle-participle*) **upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours:**

call: *Present-continuous action in the present. Middle-the subject as acting with reference to himself. Participle-contemplates action as real or actual.*

1 Corinthians 1:⁴I give thanks to my God always for you because of the **grace of God that was given you in Christ Jesus,** ⁵that in every way you were enriched in him in all speech and all knowledge— ⁶even as the testimony about Christ was confirmed among you— ⁷so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift, as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ, ⁸**who will sustain you to the end,** guiltless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹ **God is faithful, by whom you were called** into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

¹⁷For Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach **the gospel,** and not with words of eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power. ¹⁸For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, **but to us who are BEING saved** it is the power of God. ¹⁹For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." ²⁰Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? ²¹For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what **we preach to save** (*aorist-active-infinitive*) **those who believe.**

save: *Aorist- undefined as to the progress or the completion of the action.. Active- the subject is acting. Infinitive- implies potential or possibly.*

²⁴but to those who **are called,** both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.

²⁶For consider **your calling,** brothers: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. ²⁷**But God chose** what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; **God chose** what is weak in the world to shame the strong; ²⁸**God chose** what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, ²⁹so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. ³⁰And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption, ³¹so that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."
